


WANDERER FESTIVAL



If you're camping at Oaklands, your bus ticket is included with your camping ticket and you do not need to purchase a ticket or register for this service.

Bega Valley Coaches also operates a daily bus service from Bega to Bermagui, via Quaama and Cobargo and return.

For those driving, the festival is a short walk or bike ride from Pambula or Pambula Beach and we encourage you to leave your car behind; parking is available however. The carpark is located directly opposite the festival on the Pambula Beach Road Reserve and only for those with a Wanderer Festival ticket.
